Welcome to **Charlie Meng**, Chief Executive Officer of the Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC)! Mr. Meng joined the staff at AFAC in August 2008. He has had a long career in nonprofit management serving as Vice President for Administration at Georgetown University and as Associate Managing Director (VP) of Administration at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts. Mr. Meng has also served as Executive Director of Human Resources at American University and as Director of Personnel Operations for the District of Columbia Government.

In the 17 years Charlie has headed AFAC, it has grown from serving 600 families to now serving nearly 4,000 families each week. In the same years, AFAC has remained committed to encouraging volunteerism in our community and in utilizing volunteers in all aspects of its activities and registering over 45,000 hours volunteer service hours during the last year.

Charlie Meng is also a noted designer of gravestones with 3 of his designs having been accepted and placed in Arlington Cemetery. He was a long-time volunteer at Food & Friends in the District of Columbia where he received their Volunteer of the Year award on three separate occasions and was elected as an Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner for Georgetown in the District of Columbia.

Charlie holds a law degree from Georgetown University and earned a Certificate in Educational Management from Harvard University.
